



Potential for WCs as data Repositories

- Writing Centers already collect A LOT of data about their populations
- Writing Centers claim universal use
- Non-attendees of Writing Centers are an under-studied population
- We lack robust research on WC impact on learning

Method- Data collection styles


Writing Center Exit Survey

- Passive Collection (easier)
- 18% response rate of attending;2.5% of total population
- More bias
- Less student engagement potential
- Targeted findings

Surveying General Population

- Active Collection
- 2% of total population, skew undergraduate
- Less bias
- More student engagement potential
- Broader findings


Method: class embedded survey work









"I consider myself a strong writer..."




"I consider myself a strong writer..."

"Writing is important in my major..."




Attendance of STEM majors


WC Online STEM majors comprised 40.9% (859 of 2159 appointments in 2015 - 2016)

> Our survey reflects this trend






STEM student visits by major (2015-2016)

Conclusions

- Value of writing varies by discipline
- Writers who report lower confidence are more likely to attend the Writing Center at OSU.
- STEM students are not using the writing center for STEM writing (mostly Gen. Eds.)
- Passively collected data is useful but so is "boots on the ground" surveying.
- Culture of writing at OSU
 - What can we do to change this assumption?
